The Southern Tenant Farmers Union was formed in Tyronza, Arkansas in 1934. This union allowed sharecroppers and tenant farmers to fight for fair wages and worker's rights. Unlike many other unions, all races were included and encouraged to work together. Members of the union were often targets of violence, but they persisted in fighting for their cause.
