Are songs poems? Are poems songs? Research songwriting as literature. How does this challenge typical notions of literature? First, discuss with your peers. Then, write about your findings. Who are some other artists besides Johnny Cash whose works are known for story-telling?


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Write a poem based on your personal background and childhood upbringing, like Johnny Cash did for many of his songs. A great example is "Five Feet High and Rising," which describes flood conditions of the region. Describe how your poem would be set to music if it were made into a song. What message do you hope to convey to your audience?

- 1. Create a track listing of 10 songs with annotations describing each song's contribution and place within the album's context.
- 2. What are the styles, genres, and themes that are notable on the album?
- 3. Finally, create the liner notes to accompany the album. Be sure to include some biographical information about Johnny Cash as well as historical context about what made the 1968 Folsom Prison concert such an iconic show.

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Select a song from the 1968 Folsom Prison concert that captures your attention and imagination. What are the themes? What rhetorical devices are used in the song? How does "song" impact literature consumption? Do a thorough song analysis.

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Shel Silverstein wrote a couple of Johnny Cash's well-known hits, including "25 Minutes to Go" and "A Boy Named Sue." What other types of literature did Silverstein produce? What is Silverstein most known for? What other collaborations did Johnny Cash have with writers and lyricists? Think about the differences and similarities of songs and poems.
